Motion by Borucki seconded by Cowan to approve the minutes from January 21, 2015 meetings.

Zibell presented the RFP's for the Engineering of South Dewey Avenue project. Zibell stated MSA and Vierbicher submitted an RFP and both candidates are qualified to perform the work. Vierbicher is teaming up with KL Engineering who is also qualified to work on DOT projects. Motion by Werner seconded by Cowan to award Vierbicher the South Dewey Avenue project for \$147,170. Greg Borucki abstained.

Zibell presented the sidewalk areas for 2015 will be are 'G' and 'H'. Motion by Cowan Seconded by Borucki to approve the sidewalk repair resolution to inspect and repair area's 'G' and 'H'.
