

# City of Reedsburg Meeting of the Common Council

## April 14, 2014

Honorary Future Mayor Dylan Gross (4<sup>th</sup> grader from Pineview elected as Future Mayor by the 4<sup>th</sup> grade class) called the regular session of the Common Council to order at 7:00pm in the Common Council Chambers.

Mayor Estes read a proclamation recognizing Arbor Day on April 25, 2014.

**Moved by Craker and seconded by Finnegan to approve the consent agenda, consisting of minutes from the Council meeting held on March 24, 2014; March Bills; Special Event Permit for Reedsburg Butterfest Arts & Craft Fair in City Park on June 14 from 5am to 5pm, waiver of fees requested; Parade Permit for Butterfest parade on June 14 from 10am to Noon, Main Street to North Webb Avenue; Operator Licenses for Valbon Abduli, Ross Bach, Mariah Baetje, Monica Haefer, Alex Jernander, Sharon Kehoe, Diane Kirt, Megan LeMoine, Heather Taylor. Motion carried 9-0.**

**Moved by Knudsen and seconded by Moon to set public hearing date of May 12, 2014 for Ordinance 1791-14 Solar and Wind Access. Motion carried 9-0 on a roll call vote.**

**Moved by Heuer and seconded by Glick to approve Certified Survey Map to combine two parcels into one – 1240 Wellington Dr; Parcel #s 2176 & 2177 – Bart & Crystal Anderson. Motion carried 9-0.**

**Moved by Craker and seconded by Knudsen to approve Certified Survey Map to divide an industrial parcel into two lots and an outlot – 1370 Fuhrman Dr; Parcel #2093-32021 – City of Reedsburg. Motion carried 9-0.**

Administrator Witt reviewed Title VI Plan for reasonable access by limited-English proficient persons to the federal US DOT funded programs, specifically the taxi service. **Moved by Werner and seconded by Peterson to approve Title VI Plan. Motion carried 9-0.**

Administrator Witt reviewed marketing plan for the City. The gigabyte internet service and the 400 State Trail are the two unique features to Reedsburg that will be used to attract more business, residents and tourist. Citizen member Jim Schullenberg questioned why the marketing plan did not more specifically address development potential on the south side of the City. **Moved by Craker and seconded by Glick to approve Marketing Plan. Motion carried 9-0.**

**Moved by Glick and seconded by Knudsen to adjourn. Motion carried 9-0. Meeting adjourned at 7:52pm.**
